University of Ladakh's Historic First Convocation Marks a Milestone

The University of Ladakh marked a momentous occasion with its first convocation held at the Sindhu Sanskriti Kendra, Leh. The ceremony, held on July 4, 2024, was a celebration of academic achievement and the spirit of progress.

K. Mehta congratulated students, parents, and welcomed Chief guest, guests, parents and media-personnel.
