Field Visit to: Leh Fort and Central Asian Museum.

A field visit to understand importance of heritage for tourism industry.

Heritage is a mirror to history and helps to develop the understanding about our ancestral cultural practices. A society without heritage is like a king without thorns. The Department of Travel and Tourism Management (DTTM), University of Ladakh organized a field visit to Leh Palace and South Asian Museum. Leh palace is a 9 storey palace and gives a panoramic view of Leh City. It is a masterpiece of architecture and hosts many cultural events to attract tourists. Leh palace is a monument of National Importance under the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act 1958. Besides this central Asian Museum is built on an old caravan campsite and a landmark destination of old silk route. It has four stories and explains about the importance of the then leh city in Silk Road trade. The artifacts, history and architecture are centered abound Ladakh, China, Turkmenistan, and Tibet. The students were escorted by Mr. Nawang Gyalchan, MTTM 2nd Semester Students. He possesses a strong knowledge about the heritage of Ladakh and conducts group tours in Ladakh.
